## Now That I Know

Last week, we heard two important and interesting mission reports. Curtis shared news about the congregation that meets in Cluj, Romania. Valdimir told us of the situation with the church in Sosnogorsk, Russia. It is so important for me to hear about how things are going on with my brethren in other parts of the world.

By knowing, I can help. Through these reports I hear of the work that is being done and I think of ways I can assist in it. Curtis shared with us that he conducts studies with individuals and preaches at services of the congregation. He told us how important it is for us to financially assist him to make these trips. Without his report I wouldn't know these things. Valdimir told us of the distribution of Bibles made possible by our financial contributions. It is encouraging to know that so much good can be done through the few dollars I give.

Through these reports I become aware of things I need to be praying about. Curtis told us the struggles the congregation in Cluj is dealing with due to the loss of several members of the congregation as a result of deaths, members moving to other places, and some becoming discouraged and leaving the faith. I can at least pray for my brethren's strength. Valdimir spoke of the persecution being experienced at the hands of the government. Laws have been passed forbidding evangelizing outside of the church building, etc. Yet, our brethren press on! In my visits with Valdimir he has shared with me the pressures to limit sharing the gospel even to the point of the congregation having to at times whisper as they sing. Government spies often infiltrate their assemblies in order to find out where and when the congregation will be giving away the bibles, etc. My brothers and sisters live daily under the threat of arrest and imprisonment. This is one of the things that impresses me most about Valdimir and Mussa. They are U.S. citizens. They don't have to go back to Russia. But, for the sake of the gospel they continue to return. In fact, they will leave next week for Sosnogorsk. I must pray for them now that I know!

This evening, Mike Knappier will report to us about the Gospel Chariot Mission efforts in Africa and his upcoming trip to work personally with them. This is one of the most successful works among our brethren and we at Mar Hill are blessed to share in it. We will hear about the progress and the needs. Once we know, we can help!

We need to hear these reports! It reminds me of what occurred in Antioch after the first mission journey of Paul and Barnabus: *“And when they had spoken the word in Perga, they went down to Attalia, and from there they sailed to Antioch, where they had been commended to the grace of God for the work that they had fulfilled. And when they arrived and gathered the church together, they declared all that God had done with them, and how he had opened a door of faith to the Gentiles”* (Acts 14:25-27).
