Fire or No Fire!

When I was nine or ten years old, my dad bought some land. I think he paid \$50 per acre or thereabouts, then worried whether he could grow enough crops and cattle to make payments to the bank!

On the property were several out-buildings that had become run down to the point of being not only useless, but dangerous. One misty, drizzly day we set fire to them! Ironically, the property was worth more without them than it had been with them.

Our Heavenly Father also burns things that prove to be useless. Jesus said, “I am the true vine, and My Father is the vinedresser. Every branch in Me that does not bear fruit He takes away. If anyone does not abide in Me, he is cast out as a branch and is withered; and they gather them and throw them into the fire, and they are burned” (John 15:1, 2a, 6).

There were other buildings on my dad’s land that we didn’t burn. How did we determine which ones to burn and which ones to leave? If the building offered some benefit, we left it; if not, we burned it.

How does the Lord determine which branches are to be burned and which are not? He uses these criteria:

- Are the branches abiding in the vine? The vine is Jesus, and the branches are disciples (vv. 1, 5). God requires every disciple to abide in Christ. Unlike branches in a literal vine, human beings have free moral agency; that is, we decide for ourselves whether or not to remain in Christ. People get into the vine (Christ) through baptism into Him (Romans 6:3; Galatians 3:27). They remain in Christ through faithfulness to Him and His word.
- Are the branches bearing fruit? Jesus said, “As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in Me. I am the vine, you are the branches . . . without Me you can do nothing” (vv. 4, 5). Even if a branch is connected to the vine, it is useless unless it bears fruit. Vineyard owners grow vines for the fruit, not just for pretty foliage. When a branch produces no fruit, the vinedresser prunes it off, and it becomes fuel for the fire!

The fruit God requires includes such things as good works (Colossians 1:10), holiness (Romans 6:22), soul-winning (John 4:35, 36), benevolence (2 Corinthians 9:10), and worship (Hebrews 13:15).

Abiding in Christ, you have the ability and the responsibility to bear fruit. By doing so, you will stay out of the fire!
