# For or Against?

My friend and fellow-preacher Larry Scarth made this insightful statement: "The Christian is the greatest argument either for or against Christianity." Most often we focus on the negative possibilities. Can a misbehaving Christian distract and discourage non-believers from studying the Scriptures and considering Christianity? Certainly so!

But Christians can also be a powerful reason for unbelievers to give Jesus and His gospel a fair hearing. Peter urged his readers to "(have) your conduct honorable among the Gentiles, that when they speak against you as evildoers, they may, by your good works which they observe, glorify God in the day of visitation" (1 Peter 2:12), that is, in the day God visits them with the gospel, see (Acts 15:14).

Is my life an argument for or against Christianity?
